Roula Abi Habib Khoury is an Associate Professor of Sociology at Saint Joseph University of Beirut where she serves as the director of the Center for the study of the modern Arab world (Centre d'Etudes pour le Monde Arabe Moderne (CEMAM) and director of the Academy for Citizenship (Académie de Formation à la citoyenneté AFC-USJ). She teaches Sociological theory, Political sociology, Sociology of religion and sociology of the Lebanese society. She has been Chair of Sociology at the same university and a visiting professor at Erfurt University in Germany. She has published several sociological articles and, in joint authorship, a book about Lebanon, thirty years after the end of the war of 1975-1990.

Jean El Khawand, USJ




Marie Anne El Khoury, LAU

Jihad Maalouf, SGUB



Joseph Maalouf, LU




Majed Moubarak, UA

Lately, his researched has focused on circular economy in aquaculture and on environmental concerns related to water productivity. He has also diversified into water conservation using aquaculture to improve water productivity. Imad's work has taken him to the USA, Latin America, West Africa, Southeast Asia and the Middle East. He has previously served on the board of the Asia-Pacific Chapter of the World Aquaculture Society and has served in various committees of WAS. He is presently the president of the Asia Pacific Aquaculture Chapter of WAS. Professor Saoud is also an educator. He has taught various biology courses but the main theme in all his teaching is the evolutionary and genetic raison d'etre of anything related to life. He believes that nothing in life can be explained without evolution. He has previously written and spoken about the evolution of ethics and morality and also about the importance of imagination in science and learning.
